This was an amazing visit! Two of the residents started responding to Zana and me.

The first resident had never said anything during prior visits. She would only stare

straight ahead, then, in 5 or 10 minutes, she would get up, walk over to us and pet Zana. .When I asked if she wanted to pet Zana, she responded, "Yes," and started petting her immediately.

The second resident normally does not want anything to do with Zana. When I asked if she wanted to pet Zana, she said, "Yes, I do!" and asked me guestions while petting her. If I remember correctly, this is the resident that asked us to leave during our first visit because Zana is a Pit Bull mix. Since that visit. when asked what kind of dog Zana is, I tell them she is a Black Lab mix.

There is a third resident that does not want us anywhere near her, so I do my best to keep our distance from her. I also keep myself between her and Zana when we approach any residents near her. Elaina, the staff person with whom I work, commented that the resident does better when Zana visits. She normally leaves the room when dogs visit, but with Zana and me, she stays in the room, but moves around to stay on the opposite side of the room from us.

along these lines. The lockdown with Covid really slowed us down. Nevertheless. Baxter


