Facilities Needing Volunteer Teams

St. Anthony's Behavioral Hospital 14200 West 134th Place, Suite 400 Olathe, KS 66062

This is a small facility with a maximum of 22 residents. It is a spacious building and all visits will be escorted and will take place in the common area. Masks are required and the mandatory Covid documentation and temperature check is required at every visit.

Each volunteer is required to have the following:

A background check and a Covid Vaccine record or exemption with a negative test each time they come to visit. St. Anthony's shares the building with the Nottingham, an assisted living facility.

Visits would be Monday through Friday. Possible visit times would be between 10:20 and 11:20 on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday, 11:00 – 12:00 Tuesday and Friday or between 2:00 and 3:00 Monday through Friday.
